Recent work

- Representing Engie in relation to several long-term gas-sale agreements (gas-pricing reviews, volume and take-or-pay matters) involving European gas producers.
- Representing Cambodia in its first arbitration before ICSID brought against it by the subsidiary of a US power producer under the local investment law and the power purchase and implementation agreements in a dispute relating to the construction of a power plant in Phnom Penh.
- Representing Nippon Asahan Aluminium (NAA), a consortium of 11 Japanese industrial companies and trading houses and the Japanese government, on the potential dispute with the Indonesian government over the valuation of NAA's majority stake in PT Indonesia Asahan Aluminium, owner of the Asahan Hydroelectric and Aluminium project in Sumatra.
- Representing Nomura in an arbitration against the Czech Republic over the failure of prominent Czech bank IPB, in which Nomura's subsidiary Saluka was the dominant foreign investor.
